RE: Request for 4 Way Stop at Rolling Hills and Joshua Road

Dear Ms. Nancy Palmer-Neely:

Further to your e-mail requesting a 4 Way Stop at Rolling Hills and Joshua Road, Transportation and Development has undertaken a review of that intersection in accordance with our Policy Regarding Placement of New All Way Stop Controls which was passed by Council in June of 1998.

Your request required updated vehicle and pedestrian counts to be completed. The new counts were undertaken to determine traffic volumes and patterns through the intersection earlier this year. The data was compiled and analyzed in accordance with the warrants and justifications as set out in the Ontario Traffic Manual (OTM Book 5).

The results show that the intersection of Rolling Hills and Joshua Road do not meet the necessary justifications warranting a 4 way stop. Based on the data collected indicating that the justifications are not met, Public Works will not be making any recommendations to Council requesting an all way stop at this location. A copy of this response will be circulated to Council as an information item.

Public Works is available to answer any specific questions you may have concerning this matter. Also note that this decision can be discussed at a Council meeting by requesting to appear in front of Council as a delegation. We trust the above addresses your query of June 2020 and our follow up with you by email in December of 2020.
