The Orangeville & District Horticultural Society has been an important part of this community for the last 55 years.

In that time, we have always had an Annual Plant Sale, Garden Tours, Bus Trips, Flower Shows and maintained a variety of Town Gardens.

Our First Meeting had 60 attendees on April 20, 1970

Our early projects included pruning the shrubbery, planting flowerbeds and planting 2 flowering crab apple trees at the Dufferin Hospital on 2nd Avenue

We tended garden beds at the Firehall, Hospital, Legion, Orangeville & District Secondary School and at the Train Station.

We also participated in the Santa Claus Parade through Downtown Orangeville.

We celebrated our 10th Anniversary in 1980.

During the Fall of 1980, to coincide with Dufferin County's Centennial, we planted over 600 tulips and daffodils.

We had beautiful flower shows and Annual Plant sales.

Our membership was up to 230 at this time. Our monthly meetings happened at Tweedsmuir Church.

Our meetings moved to the Seniors Centre.



April 18, 2020, we were poised to celebrate our 50th Anniversary, but Covid-19 changed everyone's plans.

We shifted to virtual meetings and 2 newsletters per month to keep our membership engaged.

We made sure our gardens were extra beautiful in a time where everyone felt disconnected and scared.

In 2023, a new community outreach project was started called "The Opportunity Garden." With a collaborative effort with Am Braigh Farm, we have educated and made farmers of the participants at BOSS. In the last 2 years, we have provided over 150 bags of fresh pea shoots to the Orangeville Foodbank.

During 2023, we also started giving out a scholarship to local high school graduate going into an environmental/horticultural post-secondary field.


At the end of 2023, our new website https://www.orangevillehort.com was launched.


