



Reason for Route Changes


- To improve bus arrival & departure times.
- To increase the coverage area of Orangeville Transit.
- New plan only requires two busses to operate.
- Allow for future expansion when Hansen Boulevard is completed.



Design Process

- Staff completed destination & timing analysis.
- The process involved meeting with senior staff, council, bus drivers and operations staff.
- Public Consultation PIC in Town Hall Atrium (Nov. 2024)
 & Online Surveys (Nov. 2024 & Jan-Feb. 2025)
- The Final Goal: A design that accommodated all destinations accessibly with a consistent schedule.





About These Routes

- Two routes serve four distinct route areas.
- Green route leaves the Transfer
 Hub and later becomes Pink
 route
- Orange route leaves the
 Transfer Hub and later becomes
 Blue route

- Concept 2 operates on a 45minute route cycle
- Only two transit buses are
 required to operate Concept 2



Destination Highlights

- Alder & Tony Rose Rec. Centre,
- Westside Market Village,
- 43 Bythia (from roadway)
- Local high schools
- Headwaters Health Centre
- Shopping and grocery destinations
- Increased service west of Riddell
 Road, west of Blind Line and Amelia
 Street.


Timing & Distance

New Transit Buses

At the March 10 council meeting, council received and approved report INS-2025-016 for the purchase of two new 40-foot transit buses from New Flyer.



- Concept 2 keeps the buses
 operating on main public
 roadways
- The new buses will be more robust, heavy duty and fit more riders. Will increase passenger capacity and reliability.



Accessibility Improvements

- Staff recognize the importance of accessibility
 with Public Transit
- New infrastructure will be installed along the transit routes to improve accessibility
 - & rider satisfaction after implementation







Concept 2 Implementation

- Staff is proposing an implementation date of September 1, 2025
- Roll out process will involve: T&D, Communications, Public Works,

Customer Service, First Student & CONSAT Canada.



Corporate Implications

- In 2020 the Town of Orangeville was approved for ICIP funding (\$1,869,695).
- Staff has committed funds to purchase two new diesel New Flyer Buses
- The remaining funds will be used to add AODA compliant concrete bus pads,
 transit shelters and other infrastructure.
- Staff projects reduced mileage totaling 107,000 kilometers per year after implementing Concept 2.



Conclusion

- Growing demand and increased coverage areas have resulted in delays and other unexpected issues with transit operations.
- Through public consultation, Staff determine that transit users access destinations such as shopping centres, schools, medical building, the hospital and places of employment.
- This report recommends that Council approve the proposed route changes in Concept 2 (Attachment 3). The highlights of that concept include the use of new 40-foot transit buses running on main roads and avoiding private property where the Town has minimal control.
- Solidifying Transit routes, setting attainable destination times and scheduling restores confidence and makes for a reliable transit system. The routes being proposed allow for future expansion into the west and northwest area of Town.
